OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST

Kirsty Leigh Coventry, a native of Harare, Zimbabwe, is a world record holder and winner of bronze, silver and gold Olympic medals in swimming. In 2000, while still in high school, she debuted on the world scene, reaching the semi-finals of the Millennium Olympic games and being named Zimbabwe's Sports Woman of the Year. This international attention caught the eye of the Auburn Tigers, and Coventry was recruited to join the AU women's swimming team.

During her tenure at Auburn, Coventry lead the Tigers to a NCAA Championship in 2003 and 2004. In 2005, she was the leading individual scorer in the NCAA Championships, capturing three individual titles for a second consecutive season. That same year, she competed in the World Championships in Montreal and won a gold medal in two events. During her career at Auburn, she was named the College Swimming Coaches Association Swimmer of the Meet, the 2005 SEC Swimmer of the Year, the 2004-2005 SEC Female Athlete of the Year, and the 2005 Honda Award Winner for Swimming. A graduate of the College of Human Sciences, Kirsty earned her Bachelors of Science degree in Hotel and Restaurant Management in 2006.

Kirsty's Olympic career began in 2004 when she burst onto the Olympic scene and captured three medals – a gold, silver and bronze. In the 2008 Beijing Olympics, she added to her prior success by breaking another world record and winning the gold in the Women's 200 meter backstroke, as well as three silver medals.

In addition to her gold medal record, Kirsty is a dedicated philanthropist and serves as an Ambassador to Hope for Children, a United Kingdom registered charity. She was awarded \$100,000 by President Mugabe of Zimbabwe for her success at the Olympics and gave a portion of that money to charitable organizations. She currently lives in Austin, Texas where she continues to train and serves as Volunteer Assistant Swimming Coach at the University of Texas.
